## Newspaper Obituaries Collected from Celina, Texas

The "Newspaper Obituaries Collected from Celina, Texas" will include obituaries from the 1900s through 2010 and was submitted to CCGS by Gayle Maxson, author of three Collin County cemetery books:

- 1. The people of Cottage Hill Cemetery. Denton, Texas: G. Maxson (1999)
- 2. The people of Old Celina Cemetery, Celina, Texas. Decorah, IA: Anundsen Pub. (2002)
- 3. Cottage Hill Cemetery, Collin County, Texas. Decorah, IA: Anundsen Pub. (2004)

A large portion of the obituaries were clipped from old Collin County newspapers by Juanita (Francis) Maxson, Gayle's deceased mother-in-law. Jane Huddleston at the Celina Heritage Museum allowed Gayle to transcribe six scrapbooks full of old obituaries (cut out and pasted with no documentation by persons long deceased). The Celina Record newspaper began publishing weekly in 1902. Papers from 1923-1924 are missing from the collection. **Thanks Gayle for preserving, consolidating, organizing and sharing this historical content!**

She was born December 4, 1894 in Garland, Texas, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Duncan. She was a member of College St. Church of Christ. She married William Carleton James December 8, 1920 in Collin County. She is survived by her husband of McKinney; one son, Kenneth R. James of McKinney, Texas; two daughters, Mrs. Ruth Norris of Frisco, Texas and Mrs. Doris Watts of Dallas, Texas; five grandchildren; one great-grandchild; two brothers, M. U. Duncan of Celina, Texas and Andrew J. Duncan of McKinney, Texas. Funeral services will be held 4 p.m. Saturday in Horn-Harris-Crouch Chapel with Bro. Richard Harpole and Bro. Maynard Adkins officiating. Interment will be in Cottage Hill Cemetery on the Duncan family plot. (The Celina Record, Celina, Texas, Thursday, October 28, 1976)

William Carlton James: William C. James of McKinney died Friday afternoon, October 14, 1977, in Temple, Texas. He was born December 2, 1893 in Collin County, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles James. He was a retired carpenter, member of the Baptist faith and veteran of World War I. He is survived by one son, Kenneth James of McKinney, Texas; two daughters, Mrs. Ruth Norris of Frisco, Texas and Mrs. Doris Watts of Dallas, Texas; one sister, Mrs. Annie Grandstaff of McKinney, Texas; and five grandchildren and one great-grandchild. Funeral services will be held Sunday 2:30 p.m. at Horn-Harris-Crouch Chapel with Rev. Don Christian officiating. Interment will be in Cottage Hill Cemetery in the Duncan family plot. Pallbearers will be Ray Hurst and Harold R. Hurst of McKinney, Texas; Blake R. Watts and John Garratt of Dallas, Texas; Michael R. James of Farmers Branch, Texas and Billy Norris of Frisco, Texas. <u>Herman Franklin Jenkins</u>: Former Celina Man Dies in Houston. Friends in Celina have learned of the death in a Houston hospital April 11, 1972 of Herman Jenkins, who lived in Celina in

the 1920's and worked on the Frisco railway. He was born January 12, 1904. He came to Celina as a young man and worked as a night train meeter under Jack Clark, Frisco agent. He there learned telegraphy and in 1929 moved to Cresson, Texas, where he was agent for the Frisco and later moved to Proctor, Texas as agent. He had lived since 1938 in Houston, where he was employed by the Houston Watch Company until the time of his death. He was a member of the Lindale Park Masonic Lodge and of the Eastern Star. He and his family were members of Reid Memorial Methodist Church in Houston. Mr. Jenkins is survived by his wife, Mrs. Lorean Jenkins of Houston; and one daughter, Mrs. Doris J. Haltom of Los Angeles, California, who was born in Celina in 1928. He was buried in Proctor, Texas (Comanche County). (The Celina Record, Celina, Texas, Thursday, April 18, 1972)

James W. King: A Celina, Texas pioneer who had with the exception of a few years, lived in the Celina area since before the town of Celina was founded died in a McKinney Hospital at 11:30 a.m. Sunday, August 12, 1973, after an extended illness. He was James W. King, 84, who plied his trade of barber in Celina shops and for a time in Dallas, Texas for more than 63 years. Mr. King was born on a farm between Huntsville and Gurley, Alabama and came to Texas with his parents, Green and Sally King when he was three months old, his family settling a short distance east of where the town now lies. He married Mittie DuVall on January 8, 1911 at Prosper, Texas. Mrs. King's death occurred April 6, 1972. Survivors are a son, James R. King of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; two daughters, Mrs. Louise Smyzer of Dallas, Texas and Mrs. Dora Ione Griffin of Hacienda Heights, California; a sister, Mrs. Alma Gresham of Celina, Texas; four grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. Funeral services were held Tuesday August 14<sup>th</sup> at First Presbyterian Church in Celina where Mr. King had been a member since 1906. Conducting services were Rev. Mittie (DuVall) King: Mrs. James W. King, 83, died at 7 a.m. Thursday of last week, April 6, 1972, in a McKinney, Texas hospital after a long illness. Born in Kentucky April 8, 1888, the former Mittie DuVall, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Tom DuVall. She came to Texas with her parents in 1903 settling near the town of Roland in Collin County. She and Mr. King, who survives, were married in Prosper, Texas on January 8, 1911. A Presbyterian minister named Kenyon officiating. Mrs. King was a member of First Christian Church of Celina, Texas. Survivors in addition to her husband are two daughters, Mrs. Louise Smyzer of Dallas, Texas and Iona Griffin of California; one son, James R. King of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; four brothers, Claud DuVall of Celina, Texas, Welby DuVall of Amarillo Texas, Shelby DuVall of Arkansas and Ples DuVall of Lake Dallas, Texas; four grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. Services were held Saturday at 2 p.m. in the First Christian Church of Celina, Texas with Rev. Jesse Pugh pastor officiating assisted by Rev. Byron Myrick and Maynard Atkins. John Arthur Kirby: John Arthur Kirby, 85, of Celina, Texas died 4:45 a.m. Monday, July 1, 1974, in the Celina Nursing Home. He was born April 16, 1889 in Eureka Springs, Arkansas, son of P. D. and Augusta Wiggins Kirby, but had resided in Celina, Texas for the past 74 years. A retired farmer, he married the former Ruby Weems of Celina, Texas. He is survived by his wife Ruby of Celina, Texas; four daughters, Mrs. Grady Layman, Mrs. Justine Snider, Mrs. Otis Bunch, all of Mesquite, Texas, and Mrs. Harvey Wade of Farmers Branch, Texas; one son, John C. Kirby of Celina, Texas; one brother, Ed Kirby of Dallas, Texas; two sisters, Mrs. Roscoe Foster of Dallas, Texas and Mrs. Eula Payne of California; eight grandchildren, four great-grandchildren. Funeral services will be held 2 p.m. Wednesday in the Celina First Baptist Church with Rev. Grady Layman officiating assisted by Miss Otha Anderson. Interment will be in Cottage Hill Cemetery with Scott Funeral Home in charge. (The Celina Record, Celina, Texas, Thursday, July 4, 1974)

Lola Mary (Baker) Klinglesmith: Death Sunday claimed the life of an early Celina, Weston area citizen with the passing of Mrs. Lola Mary Klinglesmith, 95. Mrs. Klinglesmith, widow of the late A. Klinglesmith, died at 9:25 a.m. Sunday, November 1, 1970, in a McKinney, Texas hospital. She was born in Marshville, Missouri on February 17, 1875, daughter of the late Wesley and Alice Farrow Baker. She crossed the Indian Territory with her parents three times before she was ten years of age. The family first came to Plano Texas, then back to Missouri and then settled between Celina and Weston while Mrs. Klinglesmith was still a small child. She was married to A. Klinglesmith in the Weston Methodist Church in 1902. Mr. Klinglesmith was a victim of an automobile accident October 9, 1943. Mrs. Klinglesmith later lived in Vernon, Texas and in Dallas, Texas for a short time and had

been living in a McKinney Nursing home until a short time before her death. Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Tuesday in Weston Methodist Church, Rev. Foy Thomas pastor officiating. Burial was in Cottage Hill Cemetery directed by Scott Funeral Home of Celina. Pallbearers were C. A. Kerrfoot, Jack Wayne Sadler, Roy Klinglesmith, Joel Clem, Rayford Cook and Grant Curtis all nephews of Mrs. Klinglesmith. Mr. Klinglesmith, a native of the Celina, Texas area lived at 3040 Rosedale in Dallas, Texas. His death occurred Tuesday, July 25, 1972, in St. Paul's Hospital in Dallas following an illness.
