- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 29.098, Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 29.098. INTENSIVE SUMMER PROGRAMS. (a) In this
- 9 section, "pilot program" means the intensive summer pilot program
- 10 for students identified as being at risk of dropping out of school
- 11 or college.
- 12 (b) The [From funds appropriated for that purpose, the]
- 13 commissioner [of education and the commissioner of higher education
- 14 by rule] shall establish a pilot program to award grants to
- 15 participating campuses to provide intensive academic instruction
- 16 during the period in which school is recessed for the summer
- 17 [semester] to promote college and workforce readiness to students
- 18 identified as being at risk of dropping out of school, as defined by
- 19 <u>Section 29.081</u> [or college]. A grant awarded under this section may
- 20 be used to fund any of the following categories of programs:
- 21 (1) [a program administered by an institution of
- 22 higher education to provide intensive academic instruction in
- 23 English language arts, mathematics, and science to facilitate the
- 24 student's transition from high school to a postsecondary

- 12 SECTION 3. Section 39.363, Education Code, is amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 39.363. FUNDING FOR CERTAIN PROGRAMS. (a) From funds
- 15 appropriated, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 16 allocate \$8.75 million each year to establish mathematics, science,
- 17 and technology teacher preparation academies under Section 21.462,
- 18 provide funding to the commissioner of education to [and] implement
- 19 and administer the program under Section 29.098, and award grants
- 20 under Section 61.0762(a)(3).
- 21 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 22 establish mathematics, science, and technology teacher preparation
- 23 academies under Section 21.462, provide funding to the commissioner
- 24 of education to [and] implement and administer the program under
- 25 Section 29.098, and award grants under Section 61.0762(a)(3) in a
- 26 manner consistent with the goals of this subchapter and the goals in
- 27 "Closing the Gaps," the state's master plan for higher education.

- 1 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
