<u>CHAPTER 29</u> H.B. No. 43

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the funding of and the making of grants by the Texas

- 3 Council on Environmental Technology.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 387.002(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The Texas Council on Environmental Technology shall
- 8 work to enhance the entrepreneurial and inventive spirit of Texans
- 9 to assist in developing solutions to air, water, and waste problems
- 10 by:
- 11 (1) identifying and evaluating new technologies and
- 12 seeking the approval of the United States Environmental Protection
- 13 Agency for and facilitating the deployment of those technologies;
- 14 [and]
- 15 (2) assisting the commission and the United States
- 16 Environmental Protection Agency in the process of ensuring credit
- 17 for new, innovative, and creative technological advancements;
- (3) competing for and managing federal grants and
  - 19 funds from other sources available for carrying out the objectives
  - 20 of the council; and
  - 21 (4) entering into public-private partnerships to
  - 22 <u>facilitate development of environmental technology infrastructure</u>
  - 23 <u>in this state</u>.
  - SECTION 2. Section 387.003, Health and Safety Code, is

- 1 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 2 (c) When making a grant under the program, the Texas Council
- 3 on Environmental Technology may collect a fee from the grant
- 4 recipient in an amount not to exceed five percent of the amount of
- 5 the grant to be used by the council only to:
- 6 (1) monitor project progress;
- 7 (2) disseminate information about project
- 8 accomplishments;
- 9 (3) track technology deployment into the marketplace;
- 10 and
- 11 (4) provide estimates of the impact that
- 12 commercialization of funded projects will have on the environment.
- SECTION 3. Section 387.005, Health and Safety Code, is
- amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 15 (f) If a member of the Texas Council on Environmental
- 16 Technology is an employee or owner of an entity that applies for a
- 17 grant under this chapter, the member, before a vote on the grant,
- 18 shall disclose the fact of the member's employment or ownership.
- 19 The disclosure must be entered into the minutes of the meeting. The
- 20 member may not vote on or otherwise participate in the awarding of
- 21 the grant. If the member does not comply with this subsection, the
- 22 entity is not eligible for the grant.
- SECTION 4. Section 387.008(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 24 amended to read as follows:
- 25 (a) The environmental research fund is an account in the
- 26 general revenue fund. The fund consists of fees collected under
- 27 Section 387.003(c) and money from gifts, grants, or donations to

- 1 the fund for designated or general use and from any other source
- 2 designated by the legislature.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
