2 Sections 485.031 through 485.035, Health and Safety Code, or
3 relating to volatile chemicals under Chapter 484, Health and Safety
4 Code; or

5 (C) engages in conduct that contains the elements
6 of an offense under Section 22.01(a)(1), Penal Code, against a
7 school district employee or a volunteer as defined by Section
8 22.053; or

9 (3) engages in conduct that contains the elements of
10 any offense listed in Subsection (a)(2)(A) or (C) or the offense of
11 aggravated robbery under Section 29.03, Penal Code, against another
12 student, without regard to whether the conduct occurs on or off of
13 school property or while attending a school-sponsored or
14 school-related activity on or off of school property.

15 SECTION 2. Section 37.007(b), Education Code, as amended by
16 this Act, applies only to the expulsion of a student who engages in
17 conduct described by that section on or after the effective date of
18 this Act.

19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
23 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
