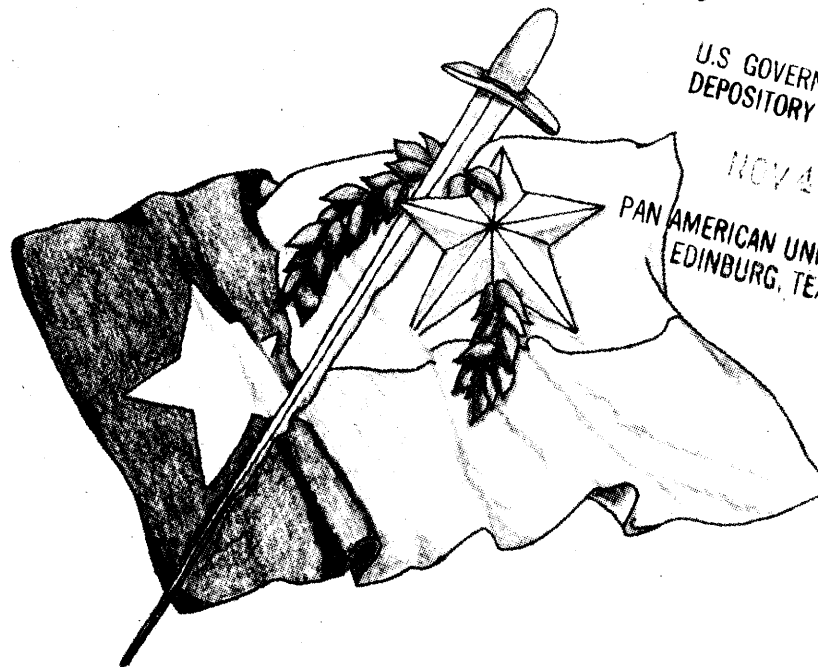

Texas Register

Material in the *Texas Register* is the property of the State of Texas. However, it may be copied, reproduced, or republished by any person for any purpose whatsoever without permission of the *Texas Register* director, provided no such republication shall bear the legend *Texas Register* or "Official" without the written permission of the director. The *Register* is published under Texas Civil Statutes, Article 6252-13a. Second class postage is paid at Austin, Texas, and additional entry offices.

Information Available: The nine sections of the *Register* represent various facets of state government. Documents contained within them include:

- Governor—appointments, executive orders, and proclamations

- Emergency Rules—rules adopted by state agencies on an emergency basis
- Proposed Rules—rules proposed for adoption

- Adopted Rules—rules adopted following a 30-day public comment period

Specific explanations on the contents of each section can be found on the beginning page of the section. The division also publishes monthly, quarterly, and annual indexes to aid in researching material published.

How To Cite: Material published in the *Texas Register* is referenced by citing the volume in which a document appears, the words "TexReg," and the beginning page number on which that document was published. For example, a document

published on page 2402 of Volume 6 (1981) is cited as follows: 6 TexReg 2402.

In order that readers may cite material more easily, page numbers are now written as citations. Example: page 2 in the lower left-hand corner of this page is written: "7 TexReg 2 issue date," while on the opposite page, in the lower right-hand corner, page 3 is written "issue date 7 TexReg 3"

How To Research: The public is invited to research rules and information of interest between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. weekdays at the *Texas Register* office, 503E Sam Houston Building, Austin. Material can be found by using *Register* indexes, the *Texas Administrative Code* (explained below), rule number, or TRD number.

Texas Administrative Code

The *Texas Administrative Code* (TAC) is the approved, collected volumes of Texas administrative rules currently being published by Shepard's/McGraw-Hill, in cooperation with this office.

How To Cite: Under the TAC scheme, each agency rule is designated by a TAC number. For example, in the citation 1 TAC §27.15:

1 indicates the title under which the agency appears in the *Texas Administrative Code* (a listing of all the titles appears below);

TAC stands for the *Texas Administrative Code*; **§27.15** is the section number of the rule (27 indicates that the rule is under Chapter 27 of Title 1; 15 represents the individual rule within the chapter).

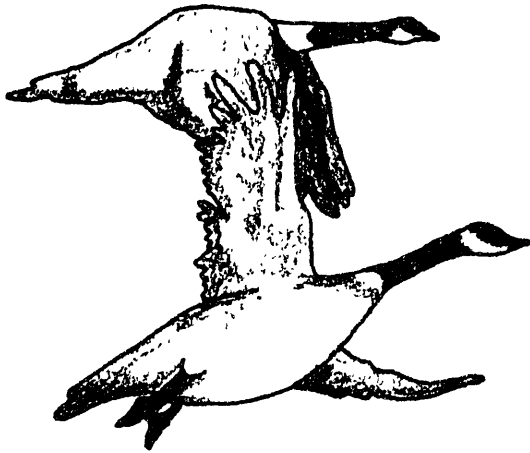

Proposed Rules

Thirty days before an agency intends to permanently adopt a new or amended rule, or repeal an existing rule, it must submit a proposal detailing the action in the *Register*. The 30-day time period gives interested persons an opportunity to review and make oral or written comments on the rule. A public hearing on the proposal may also be granted if such a procedure is requested by a governmental subdivision or agency, or by an association consisting of at least 25 members.

Unless a later date is specified or unless a federal statute or regulation requires implementation of the action on shorter notice, the proposal may not be adopted until 30 days after publication. The document, as published in the *Register*, must include a brief explanation of the proposed action; a fiscal statement indicating effect on state or local government; a statement explaining anticipated public benefits and possible economic costs to individuals required to comply with the rule; a request for public comments; a statement of legal authority under which the proposed rule is to be adopted (and the agency's interpretation of the legal authority); the text of the proposed action; and a certification statement. The certification information which includes the earliest possible date that the agency may file notice to adopt the proposal, and a telephone number to call for further information, follows each submission.

TITLE 4. AGRICULTURE Part I. Texas Department of Agriculture Chapter 7. Pesticides

4 TAC §7.1, §7.24

The Texas Department of Agriculture proposes amendments to §7.1 and new rule §7.24, concerning definitions and state-limited-use pesticides.

The Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) has authority in Texas to regulate the application of pesticides for agricultural purposes. The department derives its authority from the Texas Herbicide Law

(Texas Agriculture Code, Chapter 75) and the Texas Pesticide Control Act (Texas Agricultural Code, Chapter 76). A brief review of the department's authority and responsibilities under both of these Acts prefaces the department's proposed action.

The Texas Herbicide Law provides for regulation of the agricultural application of hormone-type herbicides. The basic regulatory structure provides for an application permitting system administered by the department. Each individual application of a hormone herbicide must be permitted by the department prior to the date of application. Applicators of herbicides, however, are not required to carry any type of general license issued by the department entitling them to access to hormone herbicides and are not required to submit to any department-sponsored training or certification program as a condition to the issuance of a permit. Custom herbicide applicators are required to post a surety bond or insurance against damages they may cause as the result of a herbicide application, and are required to license their application equipment.

The Texas Herbicide Law does not have state-wide application. Many Texas counties are exempted from its most important provisions under §75.022 of the law. Still other counties may partially or wholly exempt themselves from the law by exercising a local option provision found in §75.023 of the law. In these unregulated counties the provisions of the Texas Her-

bicide Law dealing with the permitting, insuring, and inspection of applicators are not enforceable.

The Texas Pesticide Control Act, by contrast, regulates the agricultural use of all pesticides of whatever formulation, whenever used within the state (herbicides are pesticides for purposes of this Act). The provisions of the law which apply to applicators of pesticides generally, however, are somewhat limited. Applicators of general-use pesticides are prohibited from misusing or inappropriately disposing of pesticides and are bound by certain record keeping requirements. No other restrictions are imposed on applicators generally, unless they seek to apply "restricted-use" or "state-limited-use" pesticides. Applicators of "restricted-use" or "state-limited-use" pesticides are far more pervasively regulated under the Act, because the perceived potential for harm resulting from abuse is greater for these pesticides than from those classified for general use. "Restricted-use" and "state-limited-use" pesticide applicators are required to be licensed by the department before they may have access to these types of pesticides. Licensure is in turn preceded by an extensive training and certification program administered by the department. Further, "restricted-use" and "state-limited-use" applicators are required to post evidence of financial responsibility in the form of a bond or liability insurance and submit their spraying equipment to periodic inspection. Applicators who abuse these pesticides may have their license to apply them revoked or suspended by the department, thereby denying that applicator access to "restricted-use" or "state-limited-use" formulations. This license revocation procedure has proved the most effective means for the TDA to assure the proper use, storage, and disposal of these pesticides.

The classification of a pesticide as a "restricted-use" product is the responsibility of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Currently, the agency has some 50 products so classified. In the past the department assumed those products causing the most damage or generating the most pesticide complaints in the state would be classified for "restricted-use" by the EPA and thus be subject to the more extensive strictures of the Texas Pesticide Control Act reserved for such products. The federal classification procedure, however, has not proceeded as anticipated. A recent survey of TDA pesticide complaints has revealed that more than 2/3 of the complaints investigated by the department originate from the use of nine herbicides, none of which are yet classified for "restricted-use" by the EPA. There arises, then, an undesirable paradox in the department's present enforcement posture, for the very products which are subject to the most abuse and are resulting in the most complaints, are the same ones for which no license is presently required to purchase, no training or certification is required to apply, and for which the department's most effective enforcement tool is now unavailable. Seven of these herbicides fall within the ambit of the Texas Herbicide Law, however, because of the above-cited limitations of that Act, it has proved

to be inadequate by itself in policing the use of hormone herbicides. It is desirable, therefore, to classify these nine herbicides which are subject of the majority of the department's pesticide complaints, as "state-limited-use" pesticides in order that they might be subjected to the same limitations on sale and use as are presently imposed on EPA classified "restricted-use" pesticides. This more comprehensive regulation of these products should allow the department to carry out more effectively its responsibility for assuring the safe and efficacious agricultural use of pesticides.

The proposed amendments to § 7.1 will add a definition for "state-limited-use" pesticides to the definitions already contained in the section.

The department further proposes new § 7.24, which will declare pesticides containing the following active ingredients as "state-limited-use" pesticides if distributed in containers larger than one quart or one liter: 2,4-Dichlorophenoxyacetic acid (2,4-D); 2,4-Dichlorophenoxy butric acid (2,4-DB); 2,4-Dichlorophenoxy propionic acid (2,4-DP); 2,4,5-Trichlorophenoxyacetic acid (2,4,5-T); 2-Methyl-4-Chlorophenoxyacetic acid (MCPA); 2-(2,4,5-Trichlorophenoxy) propionic acid (silvex); 3,6-Dichloro-o-anisic acid (dicamba); 3',4'-Dichloropropionanilide (propanil); and Orthoarsenic acid (arsenic acid).

Speciality fertilizer mixtures packaged in containers of 50 pounds or less containing the preceding designated active ingredients are exempt from this classification if they are labeled for ornamental use and registered as required by the Texas Agriculture Code, Chapter 63 (1981).

It is hoped that the effect of the of the new rule and proposed amendments will be to insure the safe and prudent use of these products for agricultural purposes.

William C. Neiser, director, fiscal services, has determined that for the first five-year period the rule will be in effect there will be fiscal implications as a result of enforcing or administering the rule. The effect on state government will be an estimated additional cost of \$1,700 in 1982, and \$1,600 each year for years 1983-1986. There will also be an estimated increase in revenue of \$1,700 in 1982 and \$1,600 each year for years 1983-1986. There is no anticipated economic cost to local governments which are required to comply with the rule as proposed.

David Ivie, director, agricultural and environmental sciences division, has also determined that for each year of the first five years the rule as proposed is in effect the public benefit anticipated as a result of enforcing the rule as proposed will be to insure the safe and prudent use of the named herbicides.

The possible economic cost to individuals who are required to comply with the rule as proposed will be an applicator testing fee of \$10 during the years 1982-1986, and a licensure fee of \$75 during the years 1982-1986. Insurance would also be required

of the commercial applicator. The rates are too varied and depend on widely differing coverages and are therefore too difficult to estimate.

The amendments to § 7.1 and new § 7.4 are proposed under the Texas Agriculture Code, § 76.003, which provides the Texas Department of Agriculture with the authority to adopt a list of "state-limited-use" pesticides for the entire state or for a designated area within the state.

§ 7.1. *Definitions.* In addition to the definitions set out in the Texas Agriculture Code, Chapter 76, § 76.001 (1981), the following words and terms, when used in this chapter, shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

State-limited-use pesticide—Any pesticide product classified as a state-limited-use pesticide by § 7.24 of this title (relating to State-Limited-Use Pesticides).

§ 7.24. *State-Limited-Use Pesticides.*

(a) All pesticide products containing the active ingredients as specified in paragraphs (1)-(9) of this subsection, alone or in mixtures, in any concentration, shall be classified as state-limited-use pesticides when distributed in containers of a volume larger than one quart, or, if distributed in metric measure, larger than one liter.

- (1) 2,4-Dichlorophenoxyacetic acid (2,4-D);
- (2) 2,4-Dichlorophenoxy butric acid (2,4-DB);
- (3) 2,4-Dichlorophenoxy propionic acid (2,4-DP);
- (4) 2,4,5-Trichlorophenoxyacetic acid (2,4,5-T);
- (5) 2-Methyl-4-Chlorophenoxyacetic acid (MCPA);
- (6) 2-(2,4,5-Trichlorophenoxy) propionic acid (silvex);
- (7) 3,6-Dichloro-o-anisic acid (dicamba);
- (8) 3',4'-Dichloropropionanilide (propanil); and
- (9) Orthoarsenic acid (arsenic acid).

(b) All specialty fertilizer mixtures packaged in containers of 50 pounds or less, containing the active ingredients as specified in paragraphs (1)-(9) of subsection (a) of this section, are exempt from this classification if they are labeled for ornamental use and registered as required in the Texas Agriculture Code, Chapter 63 (1981), (relating to Commercial Fertilizer).

This agency hereby certifies that the proposal has been reviewed by legal counsel and found to be within the agency's authority to adopt.

TITLE 22. EXAMINING BOARDS Part XIII. Texas Board of Licensure for Nursing Home Administrators Chapter 257. Hearing Procedures 22 TAC § 257.5

The Texas Board of Licensure for Nursing Home Administrators proposes amendments to § 257.5, concerning subpoenas. This amendment would allow the board to pay the customary fees charged by expert witnesses in disciplinary hearings, over and above the amount specified in Texas Civil Statutes, Article 6252-13a, § 14.1.

Karl E. Bishop, executive director, has determined that for the first five-year period the rule will be in effect there will be no fiscal implications to state or local government as a result of enforcing or administering the rule.

Mr. Bishop has also determined that for each year of the first five years the rule as proposed is in effect the public benefit anticipated as a result of enforcing the rule as proposed will be to insure that the highest quality of testimony can be obtained from the best qualified individuals so that the public is protected from nursing home administrators who violated licensure law. There is no anticipated economic cost to individuals who are required to comply with the rule as proposed.

The amendments are proposed under Texas Civil Statutes, Article 4442d, § 8, which provides the Texas Board of Licensure for Nursing Home Administrators with authority to make rules not inconsistent with laws as may be necessary for the performance of its duties, and to take action as may be necessary to enable the state to meet the requirements set forth in the Social Security Act, § 1908, federal rules promulgated under that ACT, and other federal authority; provided, however, that no rule shall be promulgated, altered or abolished without the approval of a 2/3 majority of the board.

§ 257.5. *Subpoenas.*

(a)-(f) (No change.)

(g) The board is authorized to pay usual and

customary fees for required expert witness subpoenaed in disciplinary hearings over and above the amount specified in Texas Civil Statutes, Article 6252-13a, §14.1, when such fees are quoted in writing and approved by the agency prior to the hearing.

TITLE 34. PUBLIC FINANCE
Part VII. State Property Tax
Board
Chapter 161. Valuation Procedures
34 TAC §161.6

The State Property Tax Board proposes amendments to §161.6, concerning the adoption by reference of the "Transportation Business Intangible Property Information Report" forms as amended. The forms as adopted by reference include: Motor Carrier, Property Information Report, V-6.03 (9/82); Annual Report—Texas Railroad Intangible Tax V-6.04 (10/81); Annual Report of Oil Pipeline Companies (1/82); and Annual Report for Bridges, Ferries, etc., V-6.11 (5/80).

Brian E. Brown, Office of General Counsel attorney, has determined that for the first five-year period the rule will be in effect there will be no fiscal implications to state or local government as a result of enforcing or administering the rule.

Mr. Brown has also determined that for each year of the first five years the rule as proposed is in effect the public benefit anticipated as a result of enforcing the rule as proposed will be to provide more accurate reporting forms by deleting irrelevant data and requiring other additional information. The new form will result in better appraisal of the intangible assets of motor carriers than in the past. There is no anticipated economic cost to individuals who are required to comply with the rule as proposed.

The amendment is proposed pursuant to rulemaking authority conferred by the Texas Property Tax Code, §24.10, which provides that the board shall implement rules prescribing the requirements of report forms submitted to the State Property Tax Board for

the purpose of appraising transportation business intangibles.

34 TAC §161.10

The State Property Tax Board proposes new §161.10, which adopts by reference a manual for appraising public access airport property. The rule was adopted on an emergency basis on June 9, 1982, and published in the June 15, 1982, issue of the *Texas Register* (7 TexReg 2306) and is now being proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. The "Guidelines for Appraisal of Public Access Airport Property" contains application verification procedures and valuation methods and principles to be used when appraising property in this classification.

Brian E. Brown, Office of General Counsel attorney, has determined that for the first five-year period the rule will be in effect there will be no fiscal implications to state or local government as a result of enforcing or administering the rule.

Mr. Brown has also determined that for each year of the first five years the rule as proposed is in effect the public benefit anticipated as a result of enforcing the rule as proposed will be to provide procedures to be used by chief appraisers to appraise property restricted to use as public access airport property. There is no anticipated economic cost to individuals who are required to comply with the rule as proposed.

The new section is proposed under the Texas Property Tax Code, §23.93(e), which provides the State Property Tax Board with the authority to promulgate rules specifying the methods to apply and the procedures to use in appraising land under this section.

§161.10. Appraisal of Public Access Airport Property. The State Property Tax Board adopts by reference "Guidelines for the Appraisal of Public Access Airport Property" to be effective January 1, 1983. This document is published by and available from the State Prop-

erty Tax Board, 9501 IH 35 North, P.O. Box 15900, Austin, Texas 78761.

An agency may take final action on a rule 30 days after a proposal has been published in the *Register*. The rule becomes effective 20 days after the agency files the correct document with the *Texas Register*, unless a later date is specified or unless a federal statute or regulation requires implementation of the action on shorter notice.

The document, as published in the *Register*, must indicate whether the rule is adopted with or without changes to the proposal. The notice must also include paragraphs which: explain the legal justification for the rule; how the rule will function; contain comments received on the proposal; list parties submitting comments for and against the rule; explain why the agency disagreed with suggested changes; and contain the agency's interpretation of the statute under which the rule was adopted.

If an agency adopts the rule without any changes to the proposed text, only the preamble of the notice and statement of legal authority will be published. The text of the rule, as appropriate, will be published only if final action is taken with alterations to the proposal. The certification information, following the submission, contains the effective date of the final action, the proposal's publication date, and a telephone number to call for further information.

13 TAC §§17.1-17.3

The Texas Historical Commission adopts new §§17.1-17.3, without changes to the proposed text published in the August 20, 1982, issue of the *Texas Register* (7 TexReg 3050).

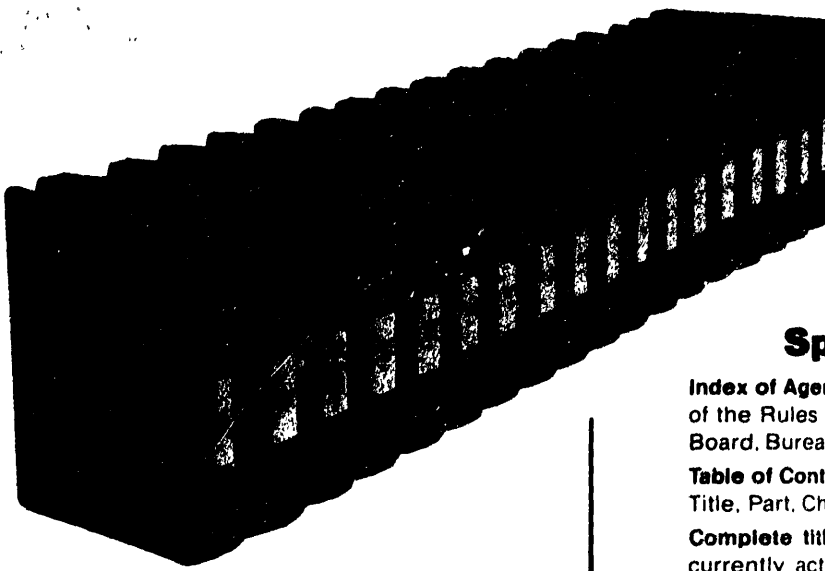

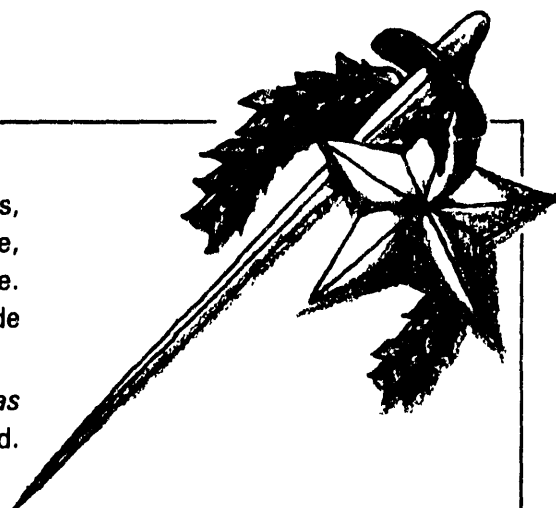
