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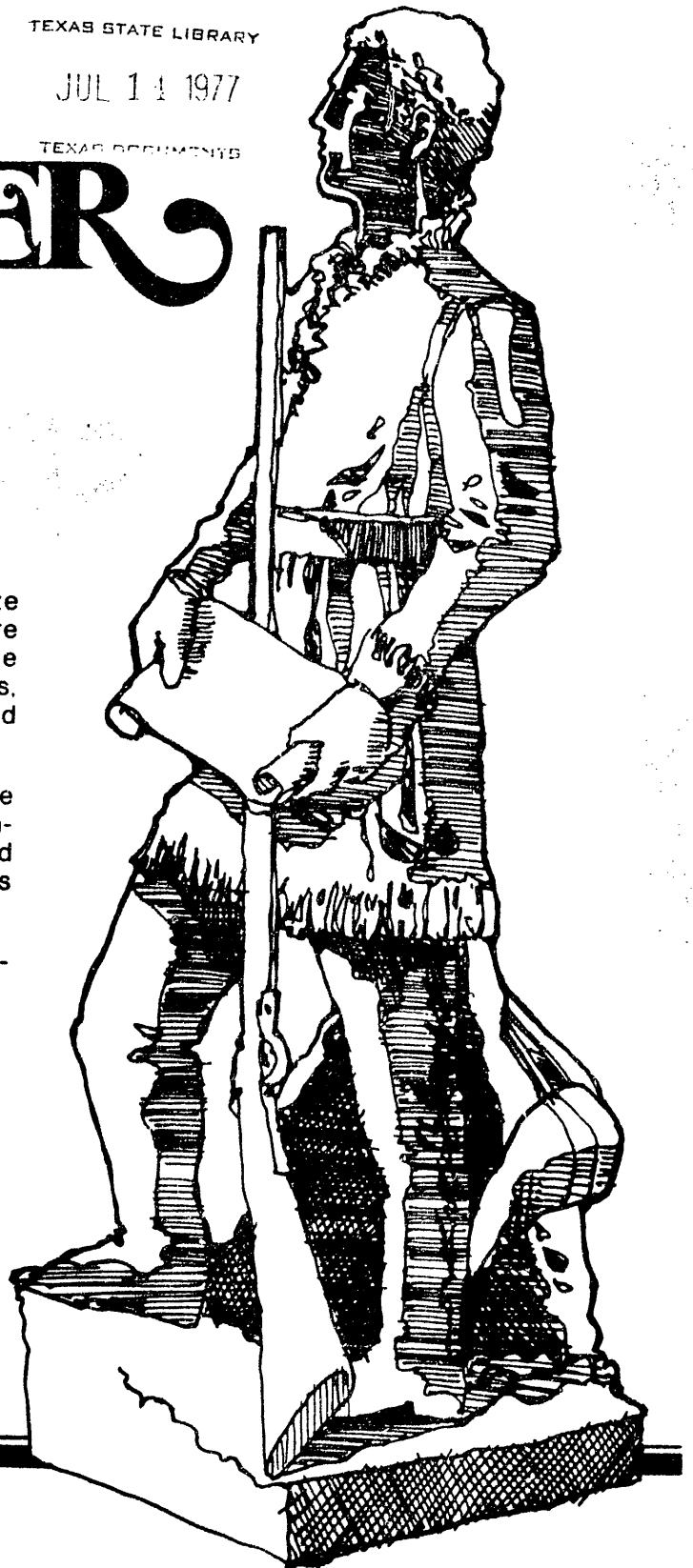

NOTES ON THE ISSUE

The State Department of Public Welfare has adopted an amendment to its rule concerning the public assistance application process in the Food Stamp Program. The amendment allows persons to apply for Aid to Families with Dependent Children benefits and public assistance food stamps on the same application form. The amendment is part of the department's efforts to consolidate forms and cut down on the paperwork involved in the application process.

In other action, DPW has adopted amendments designed to clarify the scope of services, limitations, and exclusions in the Adult Denture Program. The amended rules outline in more detail the types of services available through the program and the standards required to be met by providers.

The In Addition section of this issue contains an alphabetical listing of state agencies. Each entry in the list includes the agency name, mailing address, chief administrative officer, and staff liaison with the *Texas Register*.

An agency may adopt a proposed rule no earlier than 30 days after publication in the *Register*, except where a federal statute or regulation requires implementation of a rule on shorter notice.

An agency, on request, shall provide a statement of the reasons for and against adoption of a rule. Any interested person may request this statement before adoption or within 30 days afterward. The statement shall include the principal reasons for overruling considerations urged against the agency's decision.

Numbering System-- Each rule is designated by a unique 10-digit number which is divided into four units by decimal points. The first unit (three digits) indicates the agency which promulgates the rule. The second unit (two digits) indicates the category of rules to which the rule belongs. The third unit (two digits) indicates the subcategory of rules, if any, within the category. The fourth unit (three digits) indicates the individual rule.

The Texas Commission on Alcoholism adopts the following rule, effective June 15, 1977, pursuant to U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare approval, under the authority of Article 5561c, Texas Civil Statutes:

.001. State Plan. In compliance with Public Law 94-371, this rule adopts by reference all rules contained in the 1977 Texas State Plan for the Prevention, Treatment, and Control of Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism, which is attached to this rule as Exhibit A. Exhibit A is available for public inspection at the offices of the Texas Commission on Alcoholism, 809 Sam Houston Building, Austin, Texas, and at the Texas Register Division of the Secretary of State, located in the Texas Commodore Building, 8th and Brazos Streets, Austin, Texas.

Food Stamps

PA Application 326.15.24

The Department of Public Welfare adopts the amendment to its rule about the application process for public assistance households in the Food Stamp Program as proposed in the May 17, 1977, issue of the *Texas Register*. This amendment combines application forms for Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) recipients so that only one form is required to apply for both AFDC and food stamps.

No negative comments were received on the proposed amendment; however, the department has made editorial and technical changes to the final rule for clarification.

This amendment has been approved by the State Board of Public Welfare and is adopted under the authority of Article 695c, Texas Civil Statutes.

.001. PA Application Process.

(a) Public assistance households are certified for food stamps on the basis of information contained in the application for assistance and the financial services case record. The same application submitted by the household as their application for AFDC also is used as the basis for PA food stamp eligibility. There should not be a separate application process for PA food stamps. Verification for PA food stamp certification is not required unless information submitted by the household is unclear, incomplete, or inconsistent.

(b) Public assistance applicants and recipients who want to participate in the Food Stamp Program must so indicate on their current application. However, AFDC recipients who previously responded "no" to the question on the current application must do one of the following:

- (1) change their response from "no" to "yes," sign and date the change; or
- (2) complete a new application.

(c) The need for completion of a new application should be determined by the validity of information on the current form. If circumstances have changed since the last AFDC review, a complete review of the AFDC case may be required.

Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment Program

Administration 326.39.13

The Department of Public Welfare adopts the amendment to Rule 326.39.13.010 pertaining to general services provided in the Title XIX Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (APSDT) Dental Program, as proposed in the May 3, 1977, issue of the *Texas Register*. This change will facilitate additions and deletions of authorized services for program maintenance.

No comments were received on the proposed amendment; therefore, the department adopts the amendment with no changes to the proposed material.

This amendment has been approved by the State Board of Public Welfare and is adopted under the authority of Articles 695c and 695j-1, Texas Civil Statutes.

.010. Authorized Services Payment will be made only for dental services authorized by the department as necessary for relief of pain and infection and for restoration of teeth and maintenance of dental health. These authorized services will be listed in the EPSDT Provider Manual. Payment for additional dental services may be authorized or authorization for specific services may be withdrawn when determined necessary by the department. Notice of changes in authorized services will be given to participating dental providers. When additional procedures are authorized, dentists will be paid the lesser of actual charges or the current maximum until median charge levels can be established.

Adult Denture Program Program Benefits 326.41.03

The Department of Public Welfare adopts the amendment to its rules concerning program benefits in the Adult Denture Program, as published in the May 24, 1977, issue of the *Texas Register*. The amendments clarify the scope of services, limitations, and exclusions in the Adult Denture Program.

This program is administered by the Department of Public Welfare, which has contracted with the Texas Department of Health Resources to act as the agent for delivery of the Title XIX Adult Denture Program benefits. The immediate objective of this program is to provide full and/or partial dentures for the eligible Medicaid recipients 21 years of age and over.

No comments were received on the proposed amendment; therefore, the department adopts the amendment with no changes to the proposed material.

These amendments have been adopted by the State Board of Public Welfare and are adopted under the authority of Articles 695c and 695j-1, Texas Civil Statutes.

.001. Scope of Services. Services allowable for prior authorization and payment for Medicaid recipients 21 years of age and older:

- (a) full upper and lower dentures or partial dentures or full and partial denture combinations;
- (b) denture repairs and relines.

.002. Limitations of the Title XIX Adult Denture Program.

(a) Denture unit benefits per recipient may not exceed a maximum of two oral prosthetic units which may be any combination of either full or partial maxillary and/or mandibular prosthetic units.

(b) Relining benefits permit the relining of dentures provided that such relining will make the denture serviceable. The denture need not have been obtained through the Title XIX Adult Denture Program. However, for dentures received through the Title XIX Adult Denture Program, relining may not occur sooner than 12 months after the delivery of the denture to the recipient. Subsequent relinings, regardless of the source of the denture, may not be provided more often than every 36 months.

(c) Repairs to broken denture bases and the replacement of lost or broken denture teeth must result in a fully serviceable denture.

(d) A denture unit must consist of one upper or lower removable partial or full prosthetic dental appliance.

(e) All dentures must be newly fabricated in a dental laboratory registered by the Texas State Board

of Dental Examiners or in the provider's own office facilities by legally qualified personnel.

(f) All dentures must meet the standards established by the Texas Department of Health Resources and the State Department of Public Welfare.

(g) Providers must comply with the laws relating to the practice of dentistry as set forth by the State Board of Dental Examiners.

(h) Providers are limited to those dentists duly licensed, registered, and authorized by the Texas State Board of Dental Examiners to practice dentistry in Texas and who are without prior registration imposed by the State Board of Dental Examiners.

(i) Prior written approval to the provider is required in all cases.

.003. Exclusions.

(a) No payment is allowable for dental evaluation.

(b) No payment will be made for preparation of the mouth to accept dentures.

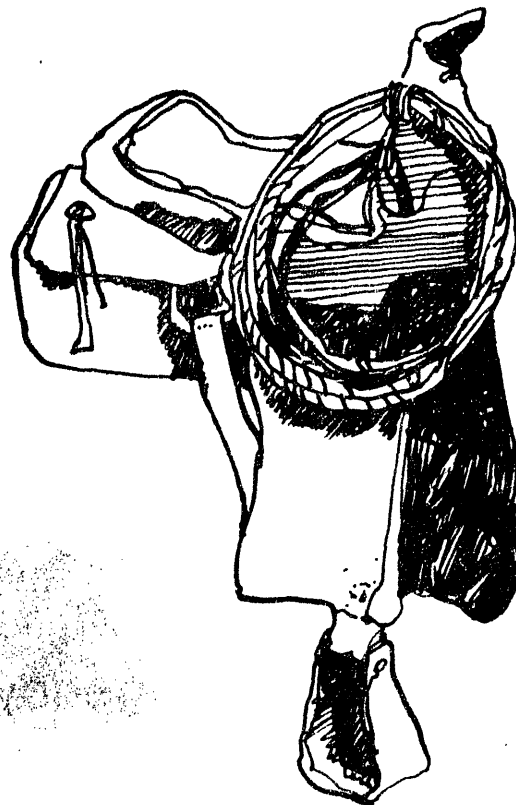
(c) No additional payment is allowable for recalls or office visits for denture adjustments.
